Guitarist Christopher Rodriguez and bassist Forrest Dodson have been playing music for nine years. They met vocalist Kelsey Castillo at Hope College and have been playing music together ever since. Each member has had classical training and has spent years perfecting their talents.

The Irish Street Musician: Celtic Kilroy

Celtic Kilroy plays a variety of instruments, including guitar, banjo, harmonica, Irish penny whistle, Irish drum and rhythm bones. He was a member of the Kwils, a popular Celtic band, which was disbanded after a twenty-year musical journey. Zach Rasmusson

Zach is an independent folk artist who writes his own original songs. Music is his passion. He has been playing the guitar for over a decade, training other musicians and leading bands along the way. Though he is a solo singer/guitarist, he uses a loop station to create a full band's sound. This will be his second year in the Series.

Puppetry and Theatre
