KALAMAZOO CARICATURIST GENE HAULENBEEK TO APPEAR AT DOWNTOWN HOLLAND STREET PERFORMER SERIES THIS THURSDAY

Holland, MI – Attendees at the Downtown Holland Street Performer Series will have the opportunity to have one-of-a-kind caricature sketches drawn of them by artist Gene Haulenbeek this Thursday, July 31. The Street Performer Series, co-sponsored by Gentex Corporation, is held every Thursday night in Downtown Holland from 6:30 pm - 8:30 pm during the summer. Each week hosts nearly 35 performers, including hula hoopers, dancers, musicians, magicians, aerial acrobats, jugglers, face painters, and many more. While the Series is free to attend, tipping the performers is highly encouraged.

Haulenbeek was born and raised in New Jersey but has been a Michigan resident since 1968 when he came to Holland to attend Hope College. He first became interested in caricatures in his late teens when he came to know Al Hartley, who was at one time an artist for the Archie comic series as well as the producer of the Spire Christian Comics. Upon watching Hartley sketch a quick caricature of their pastor during church one morning, Haulenbeek became captivated by caricature art. Self-taught, Haulenbeek draws caricatures of faces and puts the people into a comical scene. While this takes a little longer than normal caricatures, the result has been "frame-worthy," according to many of his subjects.

"It is always fun meeting people and attempting to field their requests," said Haulenbeek. "Generally, the ideas come straight out of my head though and the impact is always fun. The subject of a drawing does not get to see the picture until I finish and I always appreciate the reaction after the reveal."

Breaktime

Breaktime is a barbershop quartet composed of members of the Holland Windmill Chorus. They have performed at churches, schools, parties, corporate functions and the Street Performer Series for over three years.

Corey is a nationally renowned caricaturist, having illustrated for events all over the country. Trained under MAD Magazine's Tom Richmond, his flair for comedy and exaggeration is guaranteed to tickle your funny bone.

Circle Junkeez Crew

The Circle Junkeez are a dynamic b-boy style dance crew from Holland who love to perform and entertain audiences. They travel throughout the Midwest and across the United States to battle in top-notch break-dancing competitions.

Connor Scholten "Flying Fingers"

Connor has competed in several competitions around the country and has won multiple awards, including the Michigan State Yo-Yo Championship and the 2ndannual Grand Rapid's Got Talent Competition. Hannah is a music aficionada and has taught herself how to play the guitar as well as the ukulele. She has been playing the banjo for two years, and the violin for six years. She will be accompanying herself vocally as she performs. This is her second year in the Series.

Mady learned her balloon twisting talents from her mother when she was just 10 years old. She can make 25 different balloon animals, bracelets and swords and enjoys working with children at a variety of community and church events.

Marlies is a 13-year-old singer and guitarist who plays a mix of pop and country favorites as well as a few well-known classics. She has been playing since she was eleven, and loves to captivate audiences with her musical talents.

Mat Emerick

Mat engages the audience with a gift for comedy, mimicry and silent acting reminiscent of great mimes and physical comedians like Charlie Chaplin, Buster Keaton and Red Skelton. Mat tosses, balances and spins a variety of objects in a juggling show that will both excite and amuse an audience of any age.

Celtic Kilroy plays a variety of instruments, including guitar, banjo, harmonica, Irish penny whistle, Irish drum and rhythm bones. He was a member of the Kwils, a popular Celtic band, which was disbanded after a twenty-year musical journey. In 2012 Celtic Kilroy also began studying the art of human statue, which has become one of the most favorite attractions at many events.

The Jimmy Rustlerz

Jordan Hill and Micah Gargala make up this instrumental acoustic guitar duo. With a combined 18 years of guitar experience between the two of them, they have built a lot of chemistry together, which translates into fresh improvisation that makes every performance unique. This will be their fourth year in the Street Performer Series.

Trino began his journey in magic at the age of 13 as a way to pick up girls...not long after he realized that wasn't going to happen! With a unique style, Trino has helped bring magic up-to-date by using a combination of popular music, comedy and theatrics. Trino recently won first place at West Michigan's Got Talent.
